Dear Parents/Carers,

#### Julia's House:

Julia's House is the only children's hospice charity in Dorset. It helps children with life-limiting illnesses from newborn to the age of 18. Julia's House was opened in March 2006 and has grown to have 70 nurses and carers. Julia's House is caring for around 100 children. #### Cancer Research:

Cancer Research UK is a cancer research charity whose aim is to reduce the number of deaths from cancer. It tries to find more information about prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cancer. They fund scientists, doctors and nurses in part of their effort to beat cancer sooner. # GOVERN

### Being a Governor at LMPS

Dear Parents / Guardians

You will recently have received notification that parent governor elections are shortly to be held at the school. Any parent considering offering to serve may be interested to learn a little more about what is involved.

The governing body at LMPS comprises 12 members: three parents and the staff governor are elected, whilst others are appointed or co-opted, either by the local authority or by the governing body. Although some governors are put in place by parents or staff, it is not intended that they should be there solely to carry out the wishes of any individuals, nor is it their role to deal with specific problems or concerns. The governing body has a policy in place for dealing with such matters.

Governors thus collectively provide a broad range of appropriate skills and experiences in order to support effective school planning and decision making. Every governor, however, has the wellbeing and success of the pupils and the school as their central concern.

You can meet the governors and get

Community / Governors section of the school website at

www.lmps.org. All governors share responsibility for the strategic role, setting long-term aims for the school and agreeing policies and plans for improvement. The governing body provides both support and challenge to the school and is accountable for decisions made. It is important to note, however, that governors *do not* have any involvement in the day to day management of the school, the responsibility for which lies with the head teacher. The full governing body meet 6 times a year, each half-term, from 5.30 – 7.30pm.

In addition, governors are able to contribute according to their individual strengths and interests through membership of one of the 3 sub-committees. For example, as my background is in education I serve on the Curriculum Committee and am the Special Educational Needs link governor. Some governors are more drawn to financial or premises management and sit on the Premises, Finance and Marketing Committee. Those with a particular interest in links with parents and the community serve on a third committee which has such a focus. The sub-committees meet 4 times a year, at times suited to the members.

However, whilst what I have described above is the framework for governance at LMPS, the work of the school is really brought to life through visiting the school, meeting the pupils, staff and parents, and becoming involved in the wider life of the school. I have been a governor at LMPS for 21/2 years now and find it most interesting, rewarding... and enjoyable! Seeing the children thriving, safe and well-looked after; watching them as they happily learn, play, perform and compete, keeps us grounded and helps to ensure that the schools provision is the best that it possibly can be.

So if you are interested in joining the governors and would like to know more, governors will be available for prospective parent governors to talk during parent's evenings in February. Wednesday 10th February, we will be in the main school office and studio from 4.30-5.30, Thursday 11th February, we will be there between 4.00 and 5.00pm. Alternatively, you can contact us through the main school office. . It is also worth mentioning that we have all been new to the role at some point so support will be available from fellow governors and training is offered by Dorset County Council Governor Services.



### The Cyberbullying Workshop

Rachael showed us a video of Jessie: the video was about how she was bullied at school and now the people who bullied her are now her fans. We were then asked about the benefits of mobile phones, games, tablets, email and social networking. There are lots of benefits but you must be careful to stay safe on line. We then watched another



### Year 5 LMPS School Bank Launch!!!





### Time Keeping

How many of you have still managed to keep your New Year Resolutions? They certainly can be very hard to keep in these dreary January days.

For some of us, it is especially hard to get out of a warm bed in the mornings. No harm in staying under the duvet another 5 minutes, we might think...However, did you know? Being 5 minutes late every day adds up to three days of school lost every year.

Being late can embarrass and upset your child, disrupt the lesson for all the rest of the children in the class and affect achievement. 80% attendance over 4 years of school means one full school year lost.

Research published by the Government argues that there is a clear link between poor attendance in early education and lower academic achievement. Parents and carers have a responsibility to ensure that children receive a fulltime education. As a school we share your child's attendance data with you three times a year. The next occasion will be during the Spring Parents'Evenings On Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th February.


