English: Reading into Writing

- ♦ <u>Great Expectations:</u> Using an extract from the Dickens classic, we will write a suspenseful story set in a graveyard.
- ♦ I am Malala: After reading extracts from her autobiography, we will use Malala's inspiration to write formal letters to our local MP to campaign for education for girls in Afghanistan.
- WWI Poetry: We will study British poetry from WWI and explore how the poets used figurative language to convey powerful emotions. We will write our own poems.

Science

Light

We will be exploring how light travels in a straight line, why shadows have the same shape as the objects cast from them and we will learn the parts of the human eye.

History & Geography

Industrial Revolution

We will be continuing to explore the reasons why people moved from rural to urban areas and how machines advanced; linked to geography.
